GENERAL RULES

1. The AMA rule book shall be followed in its entirety. However, District 22 supplemental rules shall govern those cases not provided for in the AMA rule book.
2. All District 22 officers--President, Vice-President/Secretary, Treasurer, Congress Delegates, Events Coordinator, Points Stewards, Director of Membership, Asst. Director of Membership, Webmaster--will be allowed complimentary admission to all AMA District 22 Sanctioned events. This will apply to gate fee only and only if the officer has a membership card as proof of office. This complimentary admission would apply to event entry only.
3. No District 22 officer or member of the Executive Board may spend more than \$400.00 without prior approval of the board.
4. Tracks or courses which do not meet AMA standards will be notified in writing by the Executive Board. The following action will be taken:
 - a. The Executive Board will ask the track referee or owner to correct the wrong.
 - b. If no action is taken to correct the problem, the Executive Board will contact the Amateur Activities Manager of the AMA requesting removal of remaining sanctions.
5. All sanctioning conflicts will be settled by the organization's attendance record at general assembly meetings.
6. Every rider participating in a District 22 event must hold a District 22 card, or an out-of-state District card to compete in District 22 events (excludes road events and semipro hill climb events).
7. Points paying events can be sanctioned with 5 days notice on open dates only.
8. District clubs and promoters are responsible for signing up riders, sending forms and money to Director of Membership within 7 working days after the event. Clubs or promoters not making payments of collected funds will be charged a \$20.00 service fee. All fees will be collected before sanctioning for the following year's events will be allowed. If fees are not sent to District 22 within 30 days, the Executive Board will contact the AMA and request removal of remaining sanctions.
9. A copy of the original AMA referee report must be sent to the Treasurer of District 22 within 7 days after the event. If the referee report is turned in

late, a penalty of \$10.00 will be assessed to the club/promoter and must be paid prior to sanctioning in the fall.

10. Points Steward will mail point standings to the top 10 riders in each class after the last point race of the year. A standard cover letter will be sent, with a time frame of 14 days to respond to any changes or corrections. After that date all points will be final. All other point standings, outside the top 10, are available upon request to the Points Steward.

11. To receive District 22 points and year end awards, you must be a current member of District 22.

12. Any new promoter/club wanting to schedule a MX D22 event must submit a surety bond or cash deposit of \$5000.00. This will be refunded when termination of events and all liabilities are settled.

*NOTE: Schedule is printed after January General Assembly Meeting. Events can be points paying after January General Assembly Meeting, but will not be on District 22 printed schedule.

ROAD RULES & POINTS

1. The AMA Rule Book shall be followed in its entirety. However, District 22 Supplemental Rules shall govern those cases not provided for in the rule book.

2. Ten points will be awarded per attendance either as participant or worker, at each AMA sanctioned event. Ten points will be paid for a rider attending out of state sanctioned events during the current year. Onion skin proof is required, and is up to the participant to obtain. No exceptions. Onion skins need to be provided to Road Points Steward by member no later than November 1st of the current year.

3. You must be a member of AMA and District 22 to have points count.

4. Ties for District 22 points will be broken by highest draw of cards by person or the Road Points Steward prior to or at the Road Banquet.

5. All AMA rules will apply to each event.

6. Sponsoring clubs, promoters or individual members shall not be eligible for any door prizes, trophies or cash prizes pertaining to the event.

7. Any sponsoring club or promoter who sanctions road events in the previous year and does not complete the Referee Report and abide by District 22 rules will not be approved for sanction without written approval by District 22 Points Steward.

8. All sanctioned District 22 Road events must give a \$.50 discount to any individual District 22 member, upon showing a current district card.

MOTOCROSS RULES & POINT SYSTEM

1. All riders under 18 years of age will send a birth certificate to the Director of Membership, with a notarized application. Parents, legal guardian or notarized consent must accompany all participants under 18 years of age.

*Points will not be awarded until you have a valid membership card.

2. District 22 State Championship Points paying system:

A) Every motocross event, properly sanctioned with the AMA and The District 22 Club Council, that is not within the 70-mile mileage limitation, will be a State Championship Series points paying event as per AMA Rules/Guidelines. There can be more than one points paying race in a single day or weekend within District 22.

B) Point accumulation for end of year awards for the District 22 Motocross Championship Series for 2008: Each rider's top 20 finishes in each class, **FROM A MINIMUM OF 4 DIFERENT TRACKS FOR MOTORCYCLES AND 3 DIFERENT TRACKS FOR ATVS**, will be used to determine the total points for that rider.

-Rider point ties will be broken by the most number of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. finishes at events with 5 or more riders in the class, then by points accumulation at events with 1-4 riders.

DISTRICT 22 CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS per class will be as follows:

21st place and down will receive 1 point.

No points shall be awarded to any rider with the following combination of scores: DNF/DNF, DNF/DNS, DNS/DNS or DNS/DNF.

C) Bonus Points Races will be held with the following criteria: Each club/promoter/location or any combination there of, who ran a successful event and submitted all required paperwork on time the previous season, is allowed to declare one sanctioned event as a Bonus Race at the official sanctioning meeting. **TRACKS OFFERING MOTORCYCLE AND ATVS MAY HAVE BONUS POINTS EVENTS FOR EITHER ON SEPARATE DATES.** In case of rainout cancellation, the Bonus Race may be rescheduled using the 5-day rescheduling guidelines. Bonus Point Races will be designated on the event schedule. Bonus Points for Bonus Points Races will be the rider's regular finishing points plus 25 Bonus Points.

3. District 22 Championship Points Classes for 2007 season:

4. All riders participating in a District 22 event must hold a current DISTRICT 22 card, or a current out-of-state district card to compete in District 22 events.

ALL CLUBS/PROMOTERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR VERIFYING PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP WHETHER IT BE A CURRENT D22 OR OUT OF STATE DISTRICT CARD. RIDER RECEIPT IS VOID AFTER 30 DAYS FROM ORIGINAL DATE.

5. The **125, +40, +25, NON-CURRENT AND WOMEN** classes are open to A, B & C riders. For B & C riders to keep (AMATEUR STATUS) eligibility for the B & C classes, the rider can not receive prize money per AMA COMPETITION RULE BOOK.

6. The **14-24 B/C** class will be a trophy class only. Engine displacement will be **122CC-OPEN WITH A MINIMUM WHEEL BASE OF 53" PER AMA RULE BOOK.**

7. NON CURRENT MX CLASS- Bikes must be 5 years or older at the start of the current calendar year. This class will run for trophies only (replaces Vintage Class).

8. Dress code will conform to current AMA RULES: AMA approved helmet, goggles, long sleeved jersey and high-top boots (minimum of 8" high).

9. The yellow flag denotes caution--penalties are up to the referee of the day. No passing on the ambulance flag--penalty will be disqualification for the day (up to discretion of the track referee).

10. A rider who was determined by the referee to be the primary cause for the event being stopped will be required to restart from the penalty line.

11. All tracks must conform to the MX start rules found in the current AMA RULES. The 2-min/1-min card or lights should be used.

12. Any rider found illegal, due to tear-down, protest, refusal to tear-down, or over/under the age limit, will be subject to penalties of the current AMA RULES.

13. Three number plates are required. **ATVS MUST HAVE VISABLE FRONT AND REAR NUMBER PLATES.** When numbered jerseys and helmets are worn, the numbers must match the numbers on the bike. Numbers must be clearly visible with contrasting colors. It is recommended that number plate colors be as follows:

A Class-White with Black numbers

B Class-Yellow with Black numbers

C Class-Black with White numbers

****NON LEGIBLE NUMBER PLATES ARE SUBJECT TO NO SCORE PER THE TRACK'S DISCRETION.**

14. Scheduling Points Paying Events

If two or more events within the **70** mile limitation are requested for any date at the official sanctioning meeting for that season, the event that receives the points should be worked out between the clubs/promoters during the official sanctioning meeting. If this can't be worked out to everyone's satisfaction, the date will be awarded using the following criteria:

A. The club/promoter with the best attendance record at the regularly scheduled District 22 Club Council Meetings for the previous year will be awarded the points for that day's event.

B. In the case that there is a tie in attendance at the District 22 Club Council Meetings for the previous year, the following will determine the points for the date. The names of any/all clubs/promoters wanting that date will be put in a hat. The District 22 Club Council President or Acting President will draw one name. That club/promoter will receive that date for the season.

C. Any events scheduled after the sanctioning meeting will yield to the dates that were scheduled during the official sanctioning meeting for the season. Any additional races scheduled within the **70** mile limitation will not receive any points towards The District 22 Motocross Series Championship. All points must be submitted to the Motocross Point's Steward electronically within 7 days of the event.

15. Rain dates will be rescheduled through DISTRICT 22 CLUB COUNCIL with 5 days between **NOTIFICATION AND RACE DATE.** DISTRICT 22 Championship Points will be given on rescheduled races providing the requested date does not violate the **70** mile restriction with races already scheduled and there is no Bonus Point Race scheduled on that date.

16. MX clubs and promoters are responsible for collecting \$1.00 per rider from each points paying class, plus 50 JR and Quad 50 classes at their events. MX clubs or Promoters should send the money and points to the MX Points Steward of DISTRICT 22 within 7 days of the event. The money is to be used for the year-end awards and promotion. If not received within 15 days MX clubs/promoters will be fined \$100.

17. For every District 22 event, all points, onionskins and race cancellations will be sent to the MX Points Steward within 7 days after the event. If not received within 15 days, MX clubs/promoters will be fined \$100.

18. Riders may not compete in 2 classes being run together in same moto. Participation in 3 classes means 3 different motos per AMA RULE BOOK.

19. The 2007 DISTRICT 22 CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON will run from March 1st through October 31st. Up to 2 more points paying races may be granted for new clubs/promoters at 1 point race per new club or promoter on open dates only. (Open date constitutes no District 22 MX event scheduled).

20. A legal ambulance, per current AMA Rule Book, must be on site at all times during AMA District 22 Sanctioned MX events.

2007 District 22 Supplemental MX Mini Cycle Rules

1. All riders under 18 years of age will send a copy of their birth certificates to the Director of Membership with a notarized application. This will serve as proof of age.

- Points will not be awarded until you have a valid membership card.

2. Maximum age is **16** years old, according to the current AMA RULE BOOK.

3. Maximum engine size is 85cc 2 stroke or 125cc 4 stroke, if only one mini class is run.

4. Any modifications may be made to the engine and frame if done in accordance with the current AMA RULE BOOK.

5. There will be a TEAR-DOWN or PROTEST FEE on all minis according to the current AMA RULE BOOK.

6. Any rider found illegal, due to tear-down, protest, refusal to tear-down, or over the age limit, will be subject to penalties of the current AMA RULE BOOK.

7. No frame replacements may be made after the first moto has started.

8. MX Mini Cycle Classes:

Class 1: 50 JR 50cc stock motorcycle division (4-6 years old)
(not a Championship Points class)

Class 2: 50 SR 50cc stock motorcycle division (7-8 years old)

Class 5: 65 JR modified motorcycle division (7-9 years old)

Class 5: 65 SR modified motorcycle division (10-11 years old)

CLASS 8: 85 JR MODIFIED MOTORCYCLE DIVISION (9-11 years old)

Class 12: 85 SR modified motorcycle division (12-15 years old)

9. 50 SR Class is up to 51cc MAXIMUM ENGINE DISPLACEMENT per AMA RULE BOOK.

10. All riders must wear an AMA approved helmet, eye protection, long sleeved shirt, and boots. Boots must be either laced, buckled, zippered, or designed and constructed for leg and foot protection in accordance with the current AMA RULE BOOK.

11. Parents, legal guardian or notarized consent must accompany all participants under 18 years of age.

12. Riders may ride a maximum of 3 youth classes per day. Riders may not compete in 2 classes being run together in same moto. Participation in 3 classes means 3 different motos.

13. Rider's eligibility is determined as per AMA Competition rulebook.
